WINTER AND EARLY SPRING

**Galanthus nivalis* – snowdrops
**Crocus* spp. – crocus
**Helleborus niger* – Christmas rose
**Eranthis hymenalis* – winter aconite
Hydrophyllum capitatum – ballhead waterleaf
Viola spp. (*V. adunca* and *V. orbiculata*) – violets
Geum triflorum – prairie smoke
Geranium viscosissimum – sticky geranium
Amelanchier alnifolia – serviceberry, saskatoon
Berberis/Mahonia spp. (*B. aquifolium*, *B. nervosa*, *B. repens*) – Oregon grape
Ribes spp. (*R. sanguineum* and *R. aureum*) – currants
Lonicera spp. (*L. ciliosa* and *L. involucrata*) – honeysuckles
Aquilegia formosa – western columbine
Penstemon fruticosus – shrubby penstemon

SUMMER

Philadelphus lewisii – mock orange
Holodiscus discolor – ocean spray
**Nepeta faassenii* – catmint
**Lavendula* spp. – lavender
Penstemon attenuatus – taper-leaved penstemon
Penstemon venustus – showy penstemon
Penstemon deustus – hot-rock penstemon
Penstemon richardsonii – Richard's penstemon
Penstemon confertus – yellow-flowered penstemon
Eriogonum herceoides – parsnip-flowered buckwheat
Eriogonum umbellatum – sulfur-flowered buckwheat
Eriogonum caespitosum – mat buckwheat
Asclepias spp. (*A. speciosa* and **A. tuberosa*) – milkweeds
Phacelia spp. (*P. heterophylla*, *P. hastata* and *P. sericeus*) – phacelia, scorpionweed
Gaillardia aristata – blanketflower
Lupinus spp. (*L. polyphyllus* & *L. sericeus*) – lupines
Sedum spp. (*S. lanceolatum*, *S. stenopetalum*, *S. debile*) – stonecrops
Campanula rotundifolia – harebells
Erigeron speciosus – western fleabane

Thorn Creek Native Seed Farm: Owned by Jacie and Wayne Jensen. Seed (packets and bulk) and seed mixes are available via their website as well as in some retail stores. Some of the retail stores will also be selling plants grown from their seed. Check out their website which has information not only on the products available but also plant characteristics and growing requirements.

Plants of the Wild: In Tekoa, Washington, many natives are available either by visiting or via their online catalog. They will have plants grown from seed from Thorn Creek Native Seed Farm. You can avoid shipping by picking them up. Phone 509-284-2848

Pleasant Hill Farm: Near Troy, run by Pat and Doug Mason, quality native plants are available, primarily from seed from Thorn Creek Native Seed Farm. Their address is 1101 Anderson Rd, Troy, ID. Phone 208-877-1434. Call for an appointment.

Fiddler's Ridge Nursery: Run by Theresa and John Greiner, located in Potlatch and Moscow, sells some native plants grown by Pleasant Hill Farms and seed from Thorn Creek Native Seed Farm. Phone 208-683-2387.

Cedar Mountain Perennials: Further away but if you are heading north past Athol you might check out their website. They sell some North Idaho natives. Phone 208-683-2387.

Sage Notes often has advertisements of nurseries in Idaho. Several in Boise and Twin Falls are excellent but are not listed here. Please see their advertisements.
